PBA Overview

- Prescribed Burn Associations (PBA) are an effective means of promoting use of prescribed fire on private lands in Texas
- Currently, nearly 11 associations with approximately 900 members in Texas.
- Concept of an "Alliance" of associations to promote communication and cooperation has been discussed over the last several years.

Alliance concept

NRCS-Conservation Innovation Grant

 Goal: Increase prescribed fire use through an Alliance of burning associations, and integration of web-based technology, particularly for education and training.

Objectives:

- Facilitate the establishment of a state-wide Prescribed Fire
 Alliance (meeting yesterday) initial steps.
- Develop a web-based clearing house or "portal" for supporting Associations/communication.
- Develop web-based training modules to support burning certification.

Do we want an Alliance?

- Strong interest in forming an Alliance of PBAs.
- Several benefits of having an Alliance:
 - Single-voice of PBAs to address issues of mutual interest (e.g., insurance coverage).
 - Increased communication and sharing of common resources (e.g., education, training, experiences, etc.)
 - Improved efficiencies in delivery of prescribed burns on private lands.

Key Issues/Priorities

- Increased communication/sharing of resources for issues of mutual interest.
- Addressing insurance liabilities for PBAs via a state-wide "voice".
- Increased education and training for Association members and target stakeholders (e.g., commissioners courts).
- Improved data collection on prescribed fire applied by PBAs.

Goals and Objectives

- Explore "umbrella" or improved insurance coverage for PBAs.
- Increase communication material for use in education and training (both internal and external).
- Facilitate the sharing of resources among PBAs.
- Mentoring of new or younger landowners.

Target Audiences

Mission (Draft)

Promote and protect the right of Texas landowners to use prescribed burning as a safe, economical, and effective habitat management practice. TAPBA will facilitate communication among member prescribed burning associations (PBA) on issues of local, state and national interest.

 Texas Alliance of Prescribed Burn Associations (TAPBA).

Alliance Functions

- Type of Alliance?
- Cooperative is a shorter term, informal relationship for sharing information only.
- Coordination is a longer term effort around a project or task, with some planning and division of roles. Some resources, rewards, and risks are shared.
- Collaborative is a mutually beneficial and well-defined relationship entered into by two or more organizations to achieve results they are more likely to achieve together than alone. Several resources, rewards, and risks are shared.

Alliance Structure

- Two representatives from each PBA; steering committee. Leadership for Alliance TBD.
- Workgroups:
 - Organization
 - Insurance
 - Finances
 - Education and Training
- Constitution or charter that captures the function, roles and responsibilities, structure, etc.
